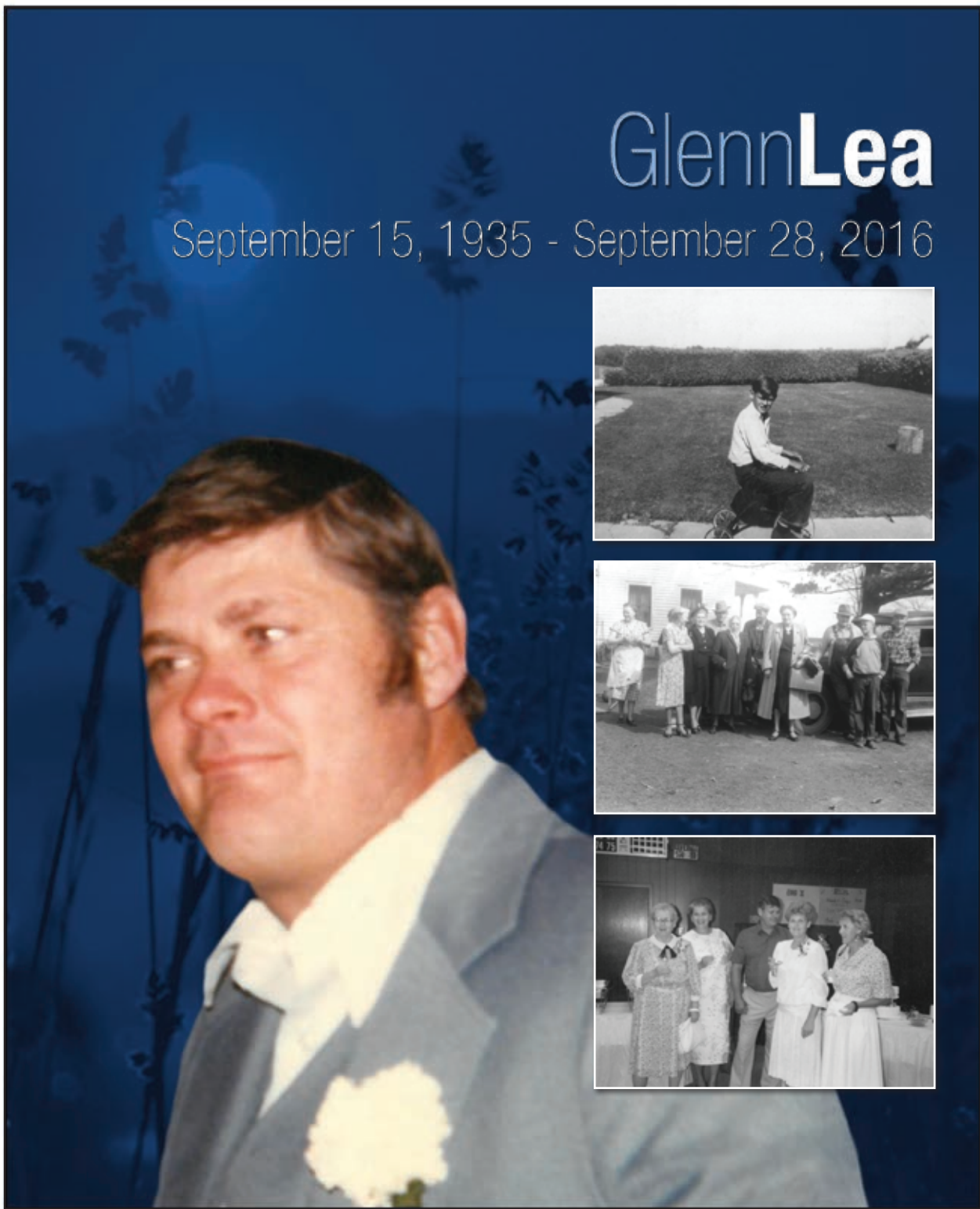


# GlennLea

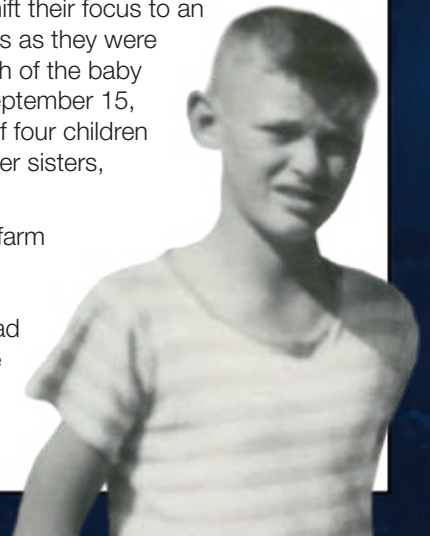


## *Glenn's Life Story*

Although he treasured his roles as a husband and father, Glenn just might have argued that nothing was better than becoming a grandfather and great-grandfather. Life will never be the same without him here, but Glenn leaves behind a timeless legacy that his loved ones will proudly carry on in his footsteps.

The 1930s were some of the most trying days we have faced as a nation as the entire decade was cloaked in the hardship of the Great Depression. Jobs were scarce, the unemployment rate soared, and things only went from bad to worse when a crippling drought covered our nation's heartland for nearly two years, adding strain to an already hurting agricultural industry. - Despite the trials around them, Albert and Gladys (Thorud) Lea were able to shift their focus to an exciting time in their own lives as they were pleased to announce the birth of the baby boy they named Glenn on September 15, 1935. He was the youngest of four children in his family and had three older sisters, Delores, Lavina, and Phyllis.

Born and raised on the family farm south of Peterson, Glenn was a typical young boy of his generation. Their homestead had been in the Lea family since the 1850s, which was something Glenn was proud of. Tragedy struck when Glenn was only





five months old with the death of his father. As a student Glenn attended local schools, and he graduated from Peterson High School in 1953.

New and exciting changes were in store for Glenn when he met the young girl of his dreams. Her name was Margaret Rebecca, and when she got into the car for their first date she sat on the opposite side of the front seat. Glenn said, "Why don't you move over to me--we're not married yet." That date led to more, and it wasn't long

before the couple found themselves deeply in love. With a desire to establish a life together they were married in 1956. Together they welcomed eight children including Kathy, Danny, Patty, Michael, Darryl, Anita, Steven, and Susie into their hearts and home. Glenn made a career farming on the Lea
