Virginia's Life Story

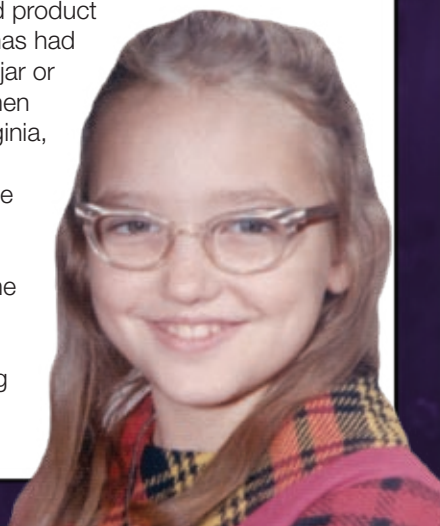
